Lone Star College is introducing Simple Syllabus, a powerful new tool intended to help standardize and streamline syllabus



creation across the college. With Simple Syllabus, you'll be able to easily update all your syllabi using a centralized template and publish them directly to D2L, while students benefit from having a consistent location, layout, and content. Simple Syllabus will be available to all LSC faculty starting this Fall.

New Quiz Experience Becoming the Default

On **May 12**, the New Quiz Evaluation Experience in D2L will become the default, which means that the Classic Quiz Evaluation interface will be retired and no longer available.

Turn it on

This updated experience has been opt-in since last November, and many instructors have already made the switch. It offers a cleaner layout, quicker access to student attempts, and a more efficient grading flow. The look and feel also match the Assignment and Discussion tools that were updated in recent years, so it should feel familiar. All the key grading features are still available and all question types are supported, though you might notice some differences in how feedback and navigation are handled.

There's nothing you need to do-this change will happen automatically.

By clicking the chatbot icon in the lower-right corner of those sites, both students and faculty can access Ellis C. to ask questions related to their online courses and course tools. Available 24/7, this additional support option is just one more way we're working to assist faculty and students and promote student success.

Final D2L Email Migration Round-up

As you are aware, Lone Star College decided to retire the internal email system within D2L. Over the past two years, the D2L email system at LSC has been compromised multiple times, resulting in student identity theft and thousands of spam messages being sent to other colleges and universities. This led to LSC emails being blacklisted, which began to affect our ability to conduct business. Given that D2L is no longer updating their email tool, they recommended we transition to our surrent M265 surteer, which offers and proved accurity. This change also simplifi

transition to our current M365 system, which offers enhanced security. This change also simplifies communication for students, as they now have a single inbox to monitor all LSC-related information.

D2L Course Purge in May

If you were teaching courses for Lone Star College in 2017, then those courses from seven years ago are scheduled to be <u>purged from D2L</u> starting on May 9.



Within the D2L environment, this means

that all data is removed, including course activities, files, student work, grades, and attendance data, and is *completely unrecoverable*. This should not be confused with the data archiving we do; these are completely different processes. Briefly, <u>archiving</u> maintains all course data. It just hides it from your main D2L homepage to keep down clutter.

If you really need to keep that 2017 course, we recommend that you <u>create a sandbox</u> and <u>copy your</u> <u>course components</u> into that. An instructional technologist or designer <u>can help you</u> with that. But be aware: this does not retain student data.

Doing a course purge will help forestall D2L performance issues caused by an overabundance of stored data and help maintain a high-quality user experience. Also, be assured that our purge policies are in compliance with both government and LSC-specific date retention policies.
