Creator+ Now Includes Lumi AI ✨

Creator+, which was announced in our [last issue](#), has already received a major update. As a reminder, the D2L Creator+ package includes [Elements](#), [Layouts](#), and [Practices](#)—all designed to help you create engaging, interactive content for your students.

Now, D2L's new generative AI model, Lumi, can assist in generating some Creator+ Practice questions. If you have an HTML content page full of information and want to add a multiple-choice question based on it, simply click "Generate Question."

You still have full control to edit the question, generate a new one, or discard it entirely. Hopefully, this feature can help spark your creativity when you're experiencing writer's block. Just remember to verify the question and answers for accuracy before you insert them into your content.

Reminder: Major Changes Coming to Email in D2L

Remember that starting on December 18, D2L Brightspace's internal email system will be discontinued and replaced with the Microsoft 365 email integration, which hosts LSC Employee Email (@lonestar.edu) and LSC Student Email (@my.lonestar.edu). This change enables faculty and students to manage course-related communication alongside their regular LSC emails, consolidating all messages in one familiar platform.

As we recommended in our last issue, be sure to **forward any D2L emails that you wish to retain** to your Lone Star College email account before December 18.

Course-related emails—such as announcements, assignment feedback, and discussion notifications—will now be delivered directly to LSC Email as well as any email you send via the Classlist. However, the Sent box in D2L will no longer be available, meaning sent emails will not be automatically saved. To retain a copy of sent messages, instructors should follow the [instructions provided](#) in our VTAC article.

Now is a great time to become familiar with the [Microsoft 365 widget](#), which is available on most D2L homepages. It shows your most recent emails in your inbox, as well as calendar and OneDrive items. For more information about the email transition, [visit our FAQ in VTAC](#).

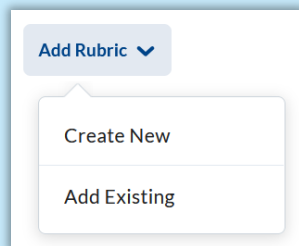
Rubrics and a New Experience Come to D2L Quizzes

D2L has answered a long-requested suggestion, by adding rubrics to quizzes. When we return from Thanksgiving, this new feature should be available; however, you must turn on the New Quiz Evaluation Experience in order to use it.

This new experience can be enabled by starting to grade a student's quiz attempt (after Thanksgiving break). You will be prompted to turn the new experience on or leave it off; you can change your mind at any time.

Once the new experience is on, attaching a rubric is quite simple. Rubrics will be attached to the Written Response—aka essay—question type. You will be able to attach an existing rubric or create a new one on the fly.

Turning now to grading, you may notice something that feels familiar about the New Quiz Evaluation Experience. That is because it is designed to have the same look and feel as Discussions and Assignments. Once you navigate to the Written Response question that has the attached rubric, using the rubric functions the same way as it does with Assignments and Discussions; you simply click on the achievement value within each criterion, and the rubric will calculate the score for you.



A word of caution is in order when using rubrics attached to a quiz: unless it is set otherwise, students can see the rubric during the exam. This might be a problem if the rubric contains the actual answer to the question.

Finally, as with Discussions and Assignments, you do not have to use your rubric; you may still enter a grade value manually. For more information, look for VTAC documentation on the new features after Thanksgiving break.

We were pleased to welcome representatives from D2L this past week for the D2L Showcase, which was livestreamed from LSC-SOUP to a wide audience of faculty and staff. The representatives from D2L gave information on upcoming D2L features like the upcoming New Content Experience (which will change the way students view course content in a big way), D2L Lumi (D2L's generative AI model for Creator+ practices), and D2L Lumi Pro (the upgraded version, which uses AI to generate quiz questions and discussion ideas based on your course content).



In addition to the Showcase, D2L held in-person meetings with various stakeholders from LSC-Online, Academic Affairs, and other departments, as well as with our D2L Support Technologists and Instructional Designers, to go over future D2L updates, evaluate the success of various tools and features within D2L, and communicate feedback collected from across the system.

YuJa Video Platform Improvements

Over the past several months, the YuJa Video Platform has rolled out an exciting set of updates designed to enhance usability and efficiency for faculty.

The **Video Editor** offers a streamlined sidebar menu for quicker access to advanced tools and light and dark modes, enabling faculty to customize their workspace. A new audio control option enables muting audio streams while preserving video playback. The upgraded Blur tool now delivers stronger effects, enhancing privacy and video clarity.



Accessibility improvements include enhanced screen-reader compatibility and keyboard functionality as well as improved live captioning quality. The new multi-language audio dubbing feature, supporting over 25 languages, further broadens content accessibility and engagement.

Faculty looking for detailed data will benefit from updated graphs and analytics in the Content Report under **Usage & Analytics**. The time it takes to generate reports has also been greatly reduced.

The refined **Media Chooser** now displays folder locations during searches and introduces a Show Files option, making it easy to view all media in a folder. Media sharing has also been streamlined with an updated search

function that filters results based on specific queries.
